Sharing your data

DWC will not share any of your personal information with funders or any other organisations without your written or verbal permission. Where you have given us your permission, you may withdraw it at any time.

Everything you tell us will be treated in the strictest of confidence unless:

- The information indicates a serious risk to yourself and or a child or another person may be at risk
- A serious threat is made to a third party or it is noted that another person may be at risk
- Disclosure from DWC is required by law or necessary in the interest of the public

Storage, retention and deletion

Your details are stored electronically on our database and on paper which is stored in locked filing cabinets

Your details will be deleted from our database and files:

- 1. If you have not engaged with us for 5 years;
 - a) For counselling purposes records will be held for 6 years
 - b) Domestic Violence purposes records will be held for 6 years
 - c) Please note that some funders require us to keep information for up to 10 years
- 2. If you wish to withdraw consent, this can done in any of the following ways:
